

NAME THAT LANDFORM!

Calling all geography buffs!

This will be a pen-and-paper event. You will be shown 50 different landforms on Google Earth and answer questions about each one. You will be asked will be both general and specific questions. For example, one question might ask, "What is this landform called?" referring to a general term such as a sea stack or an oxbow lake. More general earth science questions might ask, "What is the name of this mountain range (or river, or desert)?" Or, "What is happening to the tectonic plates in this area?" Or, "What major natural disaster happened here?" The Google Earth show will move slowly so that you can see what part of the world you're going to.

Most of the questions will involve the effects of **wind, water, ice and waves** on the earth and the landforms they carve out or deposit. You might be asked two questions about one landform, such as (1) its name and (2) what caused it.
